Psa 40:1-8

(3) He taught me to sing a new song, a song of praise to our God. Many who see this will take warning and will put their trust in the LORD.

We each have a certain amount of time on this earth, and what we spend that time doing depends solely on each of us. We can spend our time creating things which we declare as good, or we can create things which are not good.
